WELCOME TO GUEST RINGERS.....

The 10:45 a.m. Mass Sunday morning is blessed by the joyous music of two bell choirs – our parish ringers and ringers from Holy Spirit Church in Columbus. More than twenty ringers will accompany the hymns, and offer solo selections. Prior to Mass the guest ringers will play *As the Deer* arranged by Susan Nystrom on four octaves of English handbells, and Choir Chimes, which produce a more mellow tone. The two choirs will combine to ring Clem Burton's arrangement of Haydn's *St. Anthony Chorale*.

The Church has used bells in various ways over the centuries to announce the news of the Gospel as well as special moments within the liturgy. English handbell choirs have been formed in recent years as a musical expression and a wonderful vehicle for teaching music skills: reading music, rhythm, and ensemble playing. A handbell choir is a musical team comprised of individuals who each have responsibility for specific bells. Each ringer is as important as the next. Together they play the melodies and harmonies to create beautiful music. The team is a small Christian community that rehearses and plays together as one instrument to make music.

Bill Miller organized the ringers here at St. Edward the Confessor, and today marks the completion of their first season of ringing (rehearsals will resume in the fall). The Holy Spirit Church has had a handbell program for many years, and Bill has been their coach while they find a regular director. CURRENT DISASTER RESPONSES

With the best of intentions, people of faith are responding to the numerous disasters that have hit our nation recently. Currently, a second disaster threatens to overtake Joplin, MO (and other recovering areas), by way of a tidal wave of unsolicited goods (things like clothing, miscellaneous household items, mixed or perishable foodstuffs, diapers...) and volunteers who just show up to help. Critical resources are being redirected from the important work of response and relief to managing what has become a crush of unneeded donated items. Churches and social networking sites are promoting collection drives to fill semis with items that threaten to crowd warehouses and overwhelm distribution channels in the impacted areas.

Our help is urgently needed to stem the flow of unneeded goods and volunteers into disaster recovery areas like Joplin. Reach out in a way that doesn't cause further impact, but rather aids in the response and recovery effort. **Cash to a recognized voluntary agency is the single best way to help disaster survivors.** Cash doesn't need to be sorted or stored. Cash allows the recovery agency to put the donation towards the needs that most urgently need addressing.

Dwell in the House of the Lord

Acts 1:12-14
Psalm 27:1, 4, 7-8
1 Peter 4:13-16
John 17:1-11a

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Dwelling in the same house with another person or persons implies some sense of relationship and intimacy. You share many moments and experiences and there are times when you reveal many different parts of your lives, including hopes and dreams. You may have experienced this by living with a spouse, having a college roommate, or sharing a room with a sibling.

The disciples who gathered together in the upper room prayed together. There is nothing quite as intimate as praying with others for the desires close to one's heart and spirit. Psalm 27 could very well have been one they prayed together. In the face of fear and uncertainty, the psalmist asks to dwell in the Lord's house. He proclaims with confidence that the Lord is the source of light and salvation, yet asks the Lord to stay close by. Those in the upper room knew that when they gathered, the Lord was with them.

Jesus, too, prayed for the disciples. In the passage from John, we hear his prayer of petition to the Father on their behalf. Jesus asks God to protect them and keep them one with God. What better image is there than to dwell in God's house?

One thing I ask of the Lord; this I seek: / To dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life (Psalm 27:4).



SHARING FAITH

- ◆ With whom have you shared your hopes and dreams? What is it like to share that with another?
- ◆ The disciples are told not to worry about Jesus' return, but to act on the mission. Where are you called to act?
- ◆ Read Psalm 27. What images of God help you as we approach the coming of the Holy Spirit?

LIVING THE LITURGY

- ◆ The disciples devoted themselves to prayer. Find a place, perhaps in your own church or the diocesan cathedral, where you can join in prayer with a community beyond Sunday Eucharist. It might be a holy hour, devotions, or eucharistic adoration. Afterward, share that experience of prayer with another person.
- ◆ Life is full of uncertainties and worries. Make a list of things that worry you or make you afraid. Light a candle and sit with your list. Then read Psalm 27 and let God's voice speak to you. You can do this alone or in a small group. Share your experience with others if you like.
- ◆ In Peter's epistle, the pronoun *you* is plural and refers to the community. He says we share in the suffering of Christ and we suffer it together. How can you share in the suffering of others? How might you be moved to act in solidarity and unity with them?



HUMAN LIFE EXALTED

Jesus prayed on the night before he died, "Father, give me the glory I had with you before the world began." How is the glory he has in the Ascension different from the glory he had "before the world began?" It differs only in that now, he has it in a human nature.

Our humanity has been taken to the heights of heaven, fulfilling the destiny God intended for human life from the beginning. Revelation 3:21 declares, "To the one who gains the victory, I will give the right to sit with me on my throne." God's plan for us is not just that we will gather around the throne or fall down before the throne, but that we will sit with him on the throne! This hope extended to the human family by the Gospel is directly contradicted when the same human beings destined for the heights of heaven are attacked by violence, degraded in their dignity, or put to death by things like abortion. The human nature Jesus brings to glory in the Ascension is the same human nature you and I share, and the same human nature that the babies in the womb share. Celebrating the Ascension in daily life means treating each human life as one destined to sit with Christ on his throne (www.priestsforlife.org).

Just before his Ascension, Jesus charged the apostles with the task of spreading the Gospel to the whole world. At the time they didn't know exactly what he meant and how they would do it. But at his Ascension Jesus resumed his heavenly glory and began his ministry of intercession for us. He then sent the Holy Spirit to empower, guide, and sanctify the Church. In carrying out his commission, the apostles found they had received the resources they needed. They spent their time in prayer, their talent to find how to most effectively communicate the good news of Jesus, and their treasure in undertaking the work. We also have our part.
