## A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR...

1. With this weekend's celebration of Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, we, with the whole Church, prepare to enter into the Paschal Triduum (the Three Days), the heart of the liturgical year which celebrates the heart of our faith, the Paschal Mystery of Jesus Christ: His life, Passion, death and Resurrection. It is one long feast, going from sundown to sundown, beginning with the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper (Holy Thursday), through Good Friday, reaching its high point with the Easter Vigil and Mass of Easter. The forty days of Lent give way now to the fifty days of Easter. Whether here or away for Spring Break, I urge you to enter into the liturgies of Holy Week and Easter. At the Easter Vigil, we will welcome our catechumens and candidates into the waters of Baptism and full Communion with the Catholic Church. They are: Alice Burger, Elizabeth Mayberry, Graham Mayberry, Lance Mayberry, Charles Murray, Ben Pasley, Mara Shields and Morgan Shields.

Let this be our prayer for them:

My dear friends, each year, the Church celebrates this holiest of weeks with reverence and awe. We stand before the Lord Jesus, who suffered and died to save us from our sins. We are overwhelmed by this great act of love that brings new life to all who call out to God in faith. As we begin Holy Week, we pledge our prayerful support and love, for the journey that is ahead of you involves embracing the cross of Christ in a renewed way. As you reflect on the powerful words of today's liturgy, we look forward to the day when you will join us at the Eucharistic banquet.

2. Please remember in your prayers a Denison senior, Lindsay Erin Gund, who died in Washington, D.C., over the Spring Break. She was a Catholic student and was remembered at Denison in a Memorial Service on Wednesday.

3. Please take note of the change in times of services on Holy Saturday (8:00 p.m., not 5:00 p.m.), and the special Easter Sunday Masses at 7:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. (There is no Mass at Denison on Easter.)

## PALM SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION

On Palm Sunday (Passion Sunday), the Church enters the mystery of her crucified, buried, and risen Lord who, by his entrance into Jerusalem, gave a glimpse of his own majesty. Christians carry palm branches as a sign of the royal triumph that Christ won by his acceptance of the cross. Since Saint Paul says that "if only we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him" (Romans 8:17), the link between these two aspects of the Paschal mystery should stand out clearly in the liturgical celebration and catechesis of Palm Sunday. What a day of contrasts! Sunday awkwardly carries both titles because one alone would not suffice. The story of Christ's triumphal entry is recorded in all four accounts of the Gospel. This initial reading from the Gospel makes a striking counterpoint to the Passion that follows. The triumphant welcome of Jesus at the beginning of the week sharply clashes with his painful arrest and condemnation at the end. **FIRST READING:** Isaiah announces the obedience of a suffering servant, whose tongue faithfully proclaims God's word. Faithful proclamation itself opened the suffering servant to the calumny and abuse of the crowds; yet he endured mistreatment and continued to proclaim God's word. His fidelity is our salvation. **SECOND READING:** The Philippians' hymn, eloquent and poetic, speaks of a two-phase movement of Jesus' self-emptying love: the Incarnation and Crucifixion. The Incarnation is portrayed as the self-emptying of divinity through the embrace of our humanity. The Crucifixion is portrayed as the self-emptying of humanity through the embrace of a violent and cruel death. This twofold act of self-emptying love is both God's complete and total embrace of our existence and a summons to imitate the Lord in our relations with one another. **GOSPEL/PASSION:** Jesus' words concerning the new covenant memorial were followed without interlude with a prediction of the disciples' betrayal. Jesus' stark claim is ironically twisted into a conversation about the greatest among them. In the Lord's Passion and death, the very issue of greatness is played out. As the disciples, political leaders, religious groups and crowds display the weakness of betrayal, refusal to take responsibility for their actions, scapegoating and condemnation of the innocent, Jesus' greatness is displayed in steadfast fidelity, the forgiveness of sin, and the promise of life in the kingdom.

## OBSERVANCE OF LENTEN PRACTICES

Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. This means that we do not eat meat and we have only one full meal. The obligation to abstain from meat includes Catholics 14 years of age and older. The obligation to fast, limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals in the course of the day, includes Catholics from the age of 18 to 59. Those who are younger or older may also choose to observe these practices. Catholics with illnesses or dietary exceptions to these observances are exempt and encouraged to observe fast and abstinence in an alternative way.

Jesus, who upon entering into the world said: "I have come, O God, to do your will" (cf.
