WHY UNDERSTANDING TEXTING IS IMPORTANT

Texting is totally portable, private, and immediate. Kids can send messages to anyone from anywhere at anytime. In other words, they have no boundaries – unless we help them to establish some. Almost no research has been done on the impact of immediate communication on our kids' social development. But the gratification factor of getting instantaneous responses from friends has to have some affect. Any parent who has been at the dinner table or on a hike with a child only to have their pocket buzz with an incoming message knows that texts take your kids out of the moment they are in with people who are face-to-face, to connect them instead with distant friends. **Texts can be used to keep friends close, help parents figure out family logistics, and share experiences.** But as with any powerful tool, **texting can also be abused.** It can be used to bully or humiliate others. An embarrassing or upsetting image or video can quickly be transmitted or uploaded to an online video-sharing site like YouTube. Sadly, the use of texting in school cheating is on the rise, as answers can be swiftly passed from student to student. **Offer guidance to your kids in using wisely the privilege of texting.** www.CommonSenseMedia.org via The Marriage and Family Life Office, Diocese of Columbus

You Are My Servant

Isaiah 49:3, 5-6
Psalm 40:2, 4, 7-8, 8-9, 10
1 Corinthians 1:1-3
John 1:29-34

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Today we hear John's account of Jesus' Baptism by John the Baptist coupled with Isaiah's words about God's call to his servant. It seems appropriate for the Church to link these readings in order for us to reflect on Jesus Christ as a servant.

The first verse we hear in Isaiah sounds like a commissioning, as the servant is called and sent. The following verses seem to indicate an even greater trust: "I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth" (Isaiah 49:6). The servant is called to go among the Gentiles and offer God's welcome, grace, salvation, and justice. The servant has a role in history to live and offer the reign of God to all.

Spreading the Good News of salvation to all is the mission Jesus Christ accepted completely by obediently submitting to the Father's will as God's servant. The psalm today reminds us that God wants more than offerings, he wants our obedient hearts. Jesus gave his to God. Let us hope we can be as clear in our witness.

*Behold I come / To do
your will . . . is my delight
(Psalm 40:8-9).*



SHARING FAITH

- ◆ Read today's Baptism story and the one we heard last week (Matthew 3:13-17). How did Jesus live as a servant of God? How are you called to do the same?
- ◆ What does it mean to be willing to do God's will?
- ◆ What do you think about the trust that God puts in you to serve him? How does the Spirit help you?

LIVING THE LITURGY

- ◆ Many churches and businesses have mission statements that name their purpose or how they want to act in the world. Write a mission statement for your life as a Christian. What would you say is your purpose? Perhaps your family or small group might write one together for how you want to act or for what witness you want to offer in your neighborhood.
- ◆ At the end of every Eucharist, we are sent forth into the world. What does God send us to do? How do the prayers we offer at Mass or the readings we hear help us to do the work of God?
- ◆ *Ad Gentes* is the Second Vatican Council's decree on the Church's missionary activity. It means "to the nations," and it says that members of the Church are called to carry on missionary activity because they love God and want to share this love and life with others. What acts of evangelism do you perform in your life?

A NIGHT OF HOPE AND INSPIRATION


