Blessed Are the Poor in Spirit

Zephaniah 2:3, 3:12-13
 Psalm 146:6-7, 8-9, 9-10
 1 Corinthians 1:26-31
 Matthew 5:1-12a

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

The Sermon on the Mount, from which we read for the next five weeks, begins with the Beatitudes, some of Jesus' best known sayings. Each of the nine pronouncements begins with the word *blessed*, meaning "filled with deep joy." The challenge to Jesus' listeners, especially disciples, is to understand how a person attains such profound happiness through the apparently negative conditions Jesus describes.

Who does Jesus mean by the poor in spirit? The poor in spirit are those who set their hopes on God. God is the source of their strength. They are firmly rooted in God's love. All those that Jesus names: the meek, persecuted, merciful, those who hunger and thirst for righteousness can set their hopes in God. They are blessed because they have opened their lives to God's presence. God does indeed hold them, fill them with deep joy, and promise them a place in the kingdom of heaven.

He began to teach them, saying: / "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven"
 (Matthew 5:2-3).



SHARING FAITH

- ◆ The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says that the Beatitudes are the vocation of the faithful (1717). If we are the faithful, what does that mean for us?
- ◆ Read and pray Psalm 146 this week. What might God be saying to you in the images you hear?
- ◆ Which Beatitude calls out to you? How does it help you hope in God?

LIVING THE LITURGY

- ◆ Many people have worked on behalf of the poor and oppressed. César Chávez, a Mexican American labor leader, worked for rights of farm workers in California. Wangari Maathai, a Kenyan Nobel Peace Prize winner, founded the Green Belt Movement that plants trees to save the environment and helps the unemployed. Frances Xavier Cabrini, known as Mother Cabrini, was the first American citizen canonized by the church. In founding hospitals, schools, and orphanages, she reached out to the poor and immigrants. They were all ordinary people who felt called to do God's work. Find out something about them or others who have done ordinary things to make Jesus' vision in the Beatitudes possible.
- ◆ The reading from Paul's letter to the Corinthians says, "Consider your own calling, brothers" (1 Corinthians 1:26). What does that mean to you? Talk about your calling with others this week.

Paul's first converts in Corinth were not from the respectable classes in that seaport city. As he reminds them, by human standards they were not wise, strong, or noble. But God chose them anyway because "my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord" (1s 55:8). Christians cannot boast before God because it is Jesus who is our wisdom and power and righteousness. But we have no opportunity for complacency.
