Many Names for God

Isaiah 49:14–15
Psalm 62:2–3, 6–7, 8–9
1 Corinthians 4:1–5
Matthew 6:24–34

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Perhaps we sometimes wonder if God has forgotten or even abandoned us. Any woman who is close to delivering her baby will tell you that it is hard to ignore her pregnancy. The image in this Sunday's First Reading reinforces God's care for each of us by saying that even if a mother might forget the child of her womb, God will not. This is a beautiful image of how closely held we are in God's loving arms.

Psalm 62 enlarges our images of God. God is our salvation who delivers us from sin and oppression. God is a rock, a durable foundation of strength. God is a stronghold, a place of security that protects us from enemies. God is also a place of safety, a refuge shielding us from dangers. Jesus speaks of God as a master to whom followers owe allegiance and commitment above all others. As a Father, God creates life everywhere and cares for each one with the same care as the birds or the grass of the field. These are wonderful images of God for us to contemplate.



With God is my safety and my glory, / he is the rock of my strength; my refuge is in God (Psalm 62:8).

SHARING FAITH

- ◆ What images of God from the readings give you comfort? Which ones challenge you? Use them to pray this week.
- ◆ Psalm 62 tells us our souls are only at rest in God. What does it mean to rest in God?
- ◆ When have you felt lost or forsaken? How has this helped you understand when another person feels lost or alone?

LIVING THE LITURGY

- ◆ Find pictures or make a collage of images that show the different ways in which God holds us (in loving arms, under his wings, in the palm of his hand). Discuss your images with others or use them for quiet reflection each day.
- ◆ Paul tells the Corinthians that Jesus' followers should be known as servants or assistants of God. What does it mean to be a servant or assistant to God? What does it mean for your daily role and work?
- ◆ Lent will be upon us in less than two weeks. During that time we remember Jesus' journey to Jerusalem, which led to his ultimate suffering, death, and Resurrection. Jesus relied upon and trusted God during his ordeal and death. He described God as a trusted Father who never abandoned him. How can the images in today's readings help you deepen your relationship to God?

The marriage between God and His people, between Christ and His Church, is both permanent and fruitful. This bond of love cannot be broken. Moreover, it always brings about new life in the spirit. It is because the Church is the Bride of Christ that she proclaims the dignity of all human life, and calls us to welcome every life with generosity. This kind of love is seen in a particular way when we care for the weak and defenseless, both born and unborn. May the Pope's encyclical encourage us to build a culture of life!

STEWARDSHIP

That God loves His people as much as, rather, even more than a mother loves her child is the message that comes from the prophet Isaiah. Jesus assures us that God will provide what we need, because He cares for us. But we have to decide whether we trust God. We cannot serve both God and money. If we do worry about where we will get our food and drink and clothing tomorrow, we have a lack of faith in God. And, St. Paul writes in 1 Corinthians, stewards are required to be trustworthy. God has entrusted us with time, talent, and treasure. We are called to use them responsibly, aware that He will judge us on what use we have made of them. Tithing, giving a tenth of what we receive for God's service, is a practice that comes from trusting God to provide, and results in a growing awareness of his care for us.
