SACRED MUSIC IN THE MASS

We come together at the Mass to celebrate all God has entrusted to us, provided for us and in return our commitment to Him through the Church. The entire community gathered sings as an expression of our belief in the Risen Christ and our commitment to do His work here on earth as He calls us. Thus, the entire assembly is singing to God what they believe. We celebrate the meal with all the Saints of the faith. Through our singing we are moved and changed as renewed individuals who go forth from the walls of the church to do what He commands.

Each person gathered in the Mass is a part of that music ministry. Our songs are directed to God, and not sung for our own enjoyment or entertainment. We sing words from the Scripture, words of the liturgy, prayers passed to us through the ages, and prayers asking that we hear and respond to God's call. The music we sing in Mass is different than that we hear in our everyday routines. Sacred music calls for the very finest that our human condition can produce. We make this music for God. There is a great wealth of music which is appropriate for personal devotion and less formal reflective moments. Such music can stir our hearts, give us new and deeper understanding of our call from God, and even make us feel a certain emotion. However, such music is reserved for meditation outside of the Mass.

In the Mass we sing to God. We are all ministers of music singing to our Maker. Choirs, cantors, and instrumentalists encourage and enhance participation by all gathered. Their music should never overpower or compete with the celebration of the Mass. Choirs develop and share their talents through rehearsal and more complex singing. St. Edward is blessed with a fine cadre of cantors, and a good Parish Choir. There is always space for more singers in the Choir. If you would like to sharpen your music skills, come sing with the Parish Choir. Rehearsals are held Sunday mornings at 9:20 a.m. You will be guaranteed a seat on Easter morning!

Long before Moses received the 10 Commandments, God made it known to Cain that it was wrong to kill his brother. It is difficult to comprehend that we live in a land where this practice has been enshrined as a constitutional right. In Bryan/College Station, Texas, in the fall of 2004, a local group prayed for an answer about how to reduce abortion in their area. The answer God gave them was 40 Days for Life. The idea caught on and went national in 2007. Since then, it has spread to 337 cities across all 50 of the United States, seven Canadian provinces, four Australian states, plus England, Northern Ireland and Denmark. The current 40 Days for Life campaign, which involves people of all denominations, corresponds to the Christian season of Lent. Give Me a Drink

Exodus 17:3-7

Psalms 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

In today's Exodus reading, we hear Moses' frustration with the Israelites who demand he find water in the desert. He prays to God, who provides water from the rock in Horeb. The Israelites demand water but they really want God to send them a sign of his presence. It is a human story; it is easy to trust God is with us when all is right in our lives. But in our desert times, when struggle, heartache, and loss occur, we wonder where God is. Like the Israelites, we thirst for reassurance that God remains ever with us.

In today's Gospel we hear a story about water and thirst.

Jesus tells a Samaritan woman he is the source that can quench her thirst for all eternity. She does not understand. Jesus' conversation with her reveals an amazing truth: he is Christ, the Messiah, who offers her salvation. She believes and testifies to this Good News in her town, where people began to believe because of her testimony. This Lent, we, too, are invited to testify how Christ, the Messiah, quenches our thirst.

The woman left her water jar and went into the town and said to the people, "Come see a man who told me everything I have done. Could he possibly be the Christ?" (John 4:28).



SHARING FAITH

- ◆ What part of your life might you leave at Jesus' feet as you go out into the world to give witness to God's Good News?
- ◆ Have there been times when you have grumbled at God for things that happened in your life? What kind of dialogue does God invite you to have?
- ◆ What does life-giving water mean to you?

LIVING THE LITURGY

- ◆ Water for the Church is a deep symbol of new life. Water (or lack of it) in various places in the world is a sign of abundance or scarcity. The United States is rich in the abundance of water, compared to many places. How are we Christians called to use and conserve that resource for the good of all God's people?
- ◆ Pray using Psalm 95. In your reflection, explore what it means to keep your heart from hardening to God's will. Discuss it with a group or use it for daily prayer this Lent.
- ◆ The Samaritan woman acted as an evangelizer. John the Baptist was another such figure. The Catholic bishops of the United States define evangelizing as "bringing the Good News of Jesus into every human situation and seeking to convert individuals and society by the divine power of the Gospel itself" (*Go and Make Disciples*, 10, citing *Evangelii Nuntiandi*, no. 18). Where and to whom do you evangelize?

IN THE DARK

The following words were written by a young lady who had an abortion, and illustrate a common theme the Church encounters in those who have had abortions. Cases like this show the need for the efforts the pro-life movement makes to counsel those who feel pressured to abort, and to give them alternatives: "The counseling was only pro-abortion. No information was given to me about pro-life choices or agencies at the abortion clinic. They also told me it wouldn't hurt. It was extremely painful. I was not told anything about how this would affect me for the rest of my life."
