#### 2010 Bishop's Annual Appeal

Next weekend, May 1st and 2nd, will be the kickoff of the 2010 BAA. The Appeal is a concrete way that we can support the Church's mission throughout our diocese and in our own parish. Recall we are in year #3 of a special opportunity to reduce our parish building debt by another \$100,000.00, thanks to the challenge gift of \$300,000.00 by the Kearney Family of North Carolina two years ago. Up to this point, we have raised \$500,000.00 over the past two years, despite the precarious economy.

Last year's campaign brought in \$71,444.00 for the diocesan goal and \$100,000.00 for our parish goal. Some more will probably trickle in (amount so far \$198,077!!). Our new diocesan goal is \$73,319.00. If everyone would repeat their 2009 pledge and new parishioners pledge at least \$500.00 over 10 months, we will once more be successful.

If you received a pledge card by mail from the diocese, please respond as soon as possible. We will have in-pew cards available beginning next weekend and continuing throughout May. I ask every household to prayerfully consider this once-a-year request to make a pledge of \$500.00 or more if possible. I've made my pledge. Please join me.

I thank you, as does our bishop, for your past generous response. God bless you and yours.

#### FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

The Gospel for the Fourth Sunday of Easter comes from John in each year of the Lectionary cycle, in which Jesus refers to Himself as the Good Shepherd. This gives today its common designation Good Shepherd Sunday. Today is the World Day of Prayer for Vocations, established in 1964. **FIRST READING:** Paul and Barnabas' pastoral and missionary visit to Antioch was an occasion for the encouragement of the faith of the Jewish converts and an opening up of the life of faith to the Gentiles. In some sense, every effort of evangelization contains both an opportunity to encourage the faith life of those who already believe and to welcome new members into the community of faith. **SECOND READING:** John's vision of the heavenly community of salvation underscores the universal, liturgical, and ministerial dimensions of the Church on earth. John's vision reminds us that the Church on earth welcomes all who believe, worships the Lord in spirit and truth, and serves the Lord, not as isolated individuals, but as a reconciled community of faith. **GOSPEL:** Jesus links the guarantee of the salvation of His sheep to His unity with the Father. As His sheep listen to His voice and follow Him, any attempt to wrestle the sheep away from Him will be thwarted by the power of God. To hear the voice of Jesus is to dwell in communion with the living God. God's gift of salvation embraces us within the sheepfold of His beloved Son, the Church.
