A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR...

1. From the Vatican on the death of Osama bin Laden: Vatican City – The Vatican said the killing of al-Qaida leader Osama bin Laden, a man who sowed division and hatred and who caused “innumerable” deaths, should prompt serious reflection about one’s responsibility before God.

A Christian “never rejoices” in the face of a man’s death, the Vatican spokesman, Father Federico Lombardi, said in a brief statement this morning. Here is an English translation of his statement:

“Osama bin Laden, as we all know, bore the most serious responsibility for spreading divisions and hatred among populations, causing the deaths of innumerable people, and manipulating religions for this purpose. In the face of a man’s death, a Christian never rejoices, but reflects on the serious responsibilities of each person before God and before men, and hopes and works so that every event may be the occasion for the further growth of peace and not of hatred.”

Christ, Present in the Eucharist

Acts 2:14, 22-33

Psalms 16:1-2, 5, 7-8, 9-10, 11

1 Peter 1:17-21

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Christ's death and Resurrection are the heart of our Christian faith. Paul often writes about this to the communities under his care. Peter and the apostles preach it to those joining the early community of believers. Although we may take this event for granted or simply don't think about it, we are reminded by Peter's words in the First Reading that the Resurrection is real and central to our faith from the beginning.

The disciples believe and preach the Good News of the cross and Christ's Resurrection. When they gather, they do so in the name of the Messiah, who saved them by his own body and blood. Gathering at the table and remembering this mystery when they break bread is essential to expressing their belief. When the disciples who were on their way to Emmaus finally recognize Jesus in the breaking of the bread, they feel compelled to hurry and share that message of Good News. Perhaps this Easter

season, we can ponder this mystery and also hurry to share the message.

And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight (Luke 24:30-31).



SHARING FAITH

- ◆ Have you ever felt blind to Jesus' presence in your life? What has helped to open your eyes?
- ◆ If you had to tell another person about the events of Christ's Crucifixion and Resurrection, what would you say?
- ◆ The psalm asks God to show us the path of life. What path does God show you?

LIVING THE LITURGY

- ◆ When you participate in Eucharist this week, listen attentively to the Eucharistic Prayer: the central prayer of the celebration. It is said by the priest as the bread and wine is transformed into Christ's body and blood. You can read the texts of the Eucharistic Prayers that we use in liturgy on the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops website (www.usccb.org).
- ◆ The psalm speaks about God as our refuge, portion, cup, and path of life. What other images would you use to describe God? Can you share your ideas with a friend or a group? If you would like further ideas, look for words about God that are used in the psalms.
- ◆ Although it is the Easter season, this is a good time to reflect and pray using a crucifix. Jesus' triumph over the cross is at the heart of our faith. How will you pray, knowing Jesus' sacrifice and victory?
