We are beginning the lean months of the Church year, financially speaking, but even more importantly, spiritually speaking. The issues are intertwined. Simply put, with PSR Classes on hiatus, many families with children simply choose recreation and other diversions over weekly Mass attendance.

I would suggest a reordering of priorities, especially to households with children. Jesus did not say, "Do this in memory of me," nine months of the year. Please parents, "be the best teachers of your children in the ways of faith."

A related issue is the downturn in church support because of decreased attendance. We spend the rest of the year making up for these summer months. There will be an end-of-the-year summary of parish finances in an upcoming bulletin. Preliminarily speaking, it seems we may be in the red about \$10,000.00 in the last fiscal year. The diocese made us switch to accrual accounting with the preschool budget which may reveal greater income than we thought. Bottom line: we may just about finish on target!
